




A PRAYER FROM OUR CAMPAIGN CHAPLAIN, PASTOR GLEASON

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR, PASTOR BALL


One generation shall commend Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts.




activities we do together as a congregation. I pray you will take part in this effort.



A WORD FROM OUR HEADMASTER, PASTOR CASTILLERO

Imagine being a kid getting off the bus and walking through the entrance of your school. You are greeted by a smiling teacher holding the door open for you. Imagine, after putting your books in your desk, lining up for the morning's Matins chapel service followed by your favorite class. Now imagine, you are the parent walking through the halls, and you look into classrooms filled with joyful children, learning from their benevolent teachers. You hear Grammar jingles being sung in one room, the sounds of Latin paradigms recited in another, and down the hall you hear the serenade of the orchestra or choir coming from the music room which is right next to the library where a kid just excitedly left, smiling with their favorite book



clutched in their hands. Now imagine, you peek into the classrooms again and see not your children—



but your grandchildren, the next generation. You think to yourself: "This is St. Paul Lutheran School."

Meeting Today's Needs—Building for Tomorrow

As our school and church family continues to grow, we celebrate the blessings God has given us—and we also recognize the challenges that come with that growth. Our current building has served us well, but it can no longer meet all the needs of our students, families, and ministries.

This campaign is about more than bricks and mortar—it is about creating spaces where children can learn, families can be welcomed, and ministries can flourish. Below, you'll see some of the challenges we face today and how the new building will provide solutions that strengthen our mission for years to come.

Current Challenges

Limited Security Features

With multiple access points we do not have one secure dedicated entryway to the school.

Overcrowded Classrooms

Our classrooms are full, and we have reached the limits of our current building. With enrollment at 87 students, there is no additional space for new families who desire a Christ-centered education for their children.

Limited Restrooms

During school hours and at large events, students often face long lines. This creates challenges for both comfort and efficiency.

Office Space Constraints

Our current office space is cramped and not ideal for serving families, visitors, or staff. The layout limits privacy, accessibility, and a welcoming environment.

No Dedicated Spaces for Ministries

Church groups such as our Ladies Aid, the music program, library, and meeting groups currently use shared spaces, which means constant setup and tear down.

Parking Limitations

Parking has become increasingly difficult during school days, pick-up times, and church events. The shortage of spaces is inconvenient for both members and guests.

Future Solutions

Safe and Secure Learning Environment

One main entrance to the school, easily monitored, for a safer and more secure environment for our school children.

Additional Classrooms

We're growing! With room for more students, we can be excited to welcome new families and create even more opportunities for children to learn & grow together.

More Restrooms

The new building will provide additional restrooms to serve both students and visitors, making school days and special events run more smoothly.

Relocated & Expanded Offices

With the expansion, the office will move to a larger, more accessible location designed to provide a warm welcome to families and to support staff needs effectively.


Dedicated Ministry Spaces

The new addition will create designated areas for quilting, music, the library, and church meetings—spaces that are ready to use, flexible, and purposebuilt for ministry.

Expanded Parking

Once construction wraps up, additional parking will be available on the north side of the school. This improvement will make attending events more convenient and safer for our families and guests.

These are just some of the areas that will be improved through the new building project. With the support of our community, we will be able to address today's challenges and create a stronger foundation for the future.






SITE & FLOOR PLAN




A Foundation for the Future
